



Training Courses and Resources

1. Training Courses

Training coaches, athletes, parents and all the others working within and for the federation in terms of athletics is the responsibility of Turkish Athletic Federation. Therefore, Turkish Athletic Federation is supposed to provide online and/or face-to-face training sessions, and seminars in order to further inform their stakeholders. With this in mind, Turkish Athletic Federation's Safeguarding Officer(s) are supposed to follow the Safeguarding Policy of Turkish Athletic Federation and World Athletics Federation (if necessary, they will be sent to other countries' federations for workshops and seminars to develop their knowledge and skills). The first part of training courses includes recruiting appropriate people with Safeguarding certificates.

The second part of the training includes training the following groups:

- coaches;
- athletes;
- technical officials;
- volunteers;
- federation staff;
- medical staff;
- safeguarding officers;
- parents and carers
- and others

In order to train these groups of people, Turkish Athletic Federation will conduct online and/or face-to-face meetings, seminars and training programs. These training programs will include

all the subjects covered in the Safeguarding Policy prepared by Turkish Athletic Federation. Also, Safeguarding Concern Reporting Form will be translated into the local language (in this case, Turkish) and will be introduced to the individuals taking the Safeguarding trainings of Turkish Athletic Federation.

2. Resources

The resources used in the training programs will be provided by field experts (mainly universities and their academicians). Also, the guideline provided by the World Athletics will be based on. In order to include academicians, new cooperation procedures and agreements can be considered. Scientific knowledge and expertise are considered significant at this point to further improve the policies and procedures involved in the process of training individuals on the matters of Safeguarding and Gender Equality.
